1984 riots case: Court allows Sajjan Kumar to call a journalist as defence witness

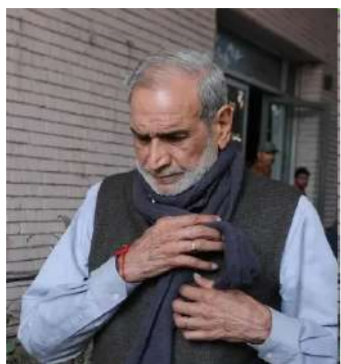
New Delhi, Former Congress MP Sajjan Kumar's plea to call a journalist as a defence witness was on Saturday accepted by a special court in Delhi hearing a case related to the 1984 anti-Sikh riots in West Delhi's Vikaspuri.

Special Judge Digvijay Singh at the Rouse Avenue Court allowed the 77-year-old politician to present the journalist as a defence witness on September 16 and fixed the next hearing in the case on that day.

Earlier, the special court recorded the former Congress MP's statement in which he claimed that he was being falsely implicated and that the cases against him were politically motivated.

He pleaded his innocence in connection with the alleged killings of two Sikhs, Sohan Singh and his son-in-law Avtar Singh, in Delhi's Janakpuri, and another incident in Vikaspuri where Gurcharan Singh was allegedly set ablaze, during the riots.

"I am innocent. I was never involved in this crime, not even in my dreams. There



is no iota of evidence against me," Sajjan Kumar said in his statement in court.

"Initially, I was not even named by any of the witnesses. Decades later, I was named. The case against me is false and politically-motivated," he added.

The infamous 1984 riots broke out after the assassination of Prime Minister Indira Gandhi by her Sikh bodyguards on October 31, 1984.

Decades later, a Special Investigation Team (SIT) was constituted on the recommendation of the Justice G.P. Mathur Committee to reopen 114 cases.

In August 2023, the trial court formally framed charges

against Sajjan Kumar under various Sections of the Indian Penal Code (IPC), but decided to drop the murder charge under Section 302, which had earlier been applied by the SIT.

In February this year, a trial court had sentenced the former Congress MP to life imprisonment for the murder of Jaswant Singh and his son Tarandeep Singh in the Saraswati Vihar area on November 1, 1984, during the riots.

The SIT found that the accused was leading a mob and, upon his instigation and abetment, the mob had burnt alive the two persons and damaged, destroyed, and looted their household articles and other property, burnt their house, and also injured the victim's family members and relatives residing in their house.

Describing the 1984 riots as one of the "darkest and most shameful" chapters in India's history, the members of the Sikh community demanded justice and urged the trial court to sentence Sajjan Kumar to death.

Sports Development Authority of Tamil Nadu launches Rs 9.7 cr project to modernise gyms statewide

Chennai, In a major step to strengthen sports infrastructure, the Sports Development Authority of Tamil Nadu (SDAT) has initiated a Rs 9.7 crore project to modernise gyms across all districts.

The objective is to provide athletes with modern training facilities at an affordable cost, ensuring that district centres match the standards of those in larger cities. With the Chennai Open tennis tournament scheduled to begin by the end of October, the gym at the Nungambakkam tennis stadium has been given special attention to ensure readiness.

The project will cover 25 gyms across Tamil Nadu, bringing upgrades such as air-conditioning, hydraulic machines, and modern fitness equipment. Renovation works, including painting, flooring, and the replacement of outdated machines, are already being carried out. District sports complexes have been prioritised to create uniform training opportunities



for athletes across the state.

Two key centres in Chennai are part of this initiative. At the Velachery complex, glass panels are being replaced, ceiling lights and new mats are being installed, and hydraulic equipment for full-body workouts is being added. Nearly a hundred athletes use the facility daily, with access remaining free for district, state, and national-level participants.

The Nungambakkam gym is being upgraded specifically to support tennis players, with wooden flooring, strength

training tools such as dumbbells, barbells, kettlebells, and resistance bands, along with cardiovascular and agility equipment, including treadmills, ellipticals, hurdles, and reaction balls.

The work is expected to be completed before the Chennai Open begins. Beyond Chennai, centres in Madurai, Tuticorin, Coimbatore, Trichy, and other districts are also being modernised, with budgets ranging between Rs 32 lakh and Rs 50 lakh for each location.

Electronic manufacturing sector surges to Rs 11.5 lakh crore, creates 25 lakh jobs: Minister

New Delhi, Under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visionary schemes, the electronics manufacturing has emerged as a top sector in India, with production increasing 6 times in past 11 years -- resulting in it becoming a Rs 11.5 lakh crore industry, Union Electronics and IT Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said on Saturday.



Millennial media consulting

Addressing a press conference at the BJP headquarters over the recent GST overhaul here, the minister said the electronic products exports jumped eight times during the period and the industry now provides employment to over 25 lakh people.

"In the last 11 years, electronics manufacturing has emerged as a very big sector in India. Electronics production has increased 6 times, exports have increased 8 times, and it has become an industry of Rs 11.5 lakh crore, providing jobs to 25 lakh people," the minister said.

Vaishnaw informed that India has now started manufacturing every single item that an electronic product needs in the country.

"If we talk about a mobile

phone, then every item of the phone -- be it glass, cover, chip, printed circuit board (PCB) or camera module, has started being produced in the country," the minister stated.

He further informed that recently, a factory was inaugurated at Sohna, Haryana, in which the battery used in the smartphone will be manufactured.

The country needs 50 crore batteries, and 20 crore battery packs will be manufactured from a single factory, the minister informed.

He urged citizens to adopt India-made products as much as they can. "It is time for a self-reliant India in which, everyone is adopting 'Swadeshi' with great enthusiasm. All of you are also requested to increase the use of 'Swadeshi' products in your life," Vaishnaw noted.

Post 'Bihar and Bidi' row, digital media cell of Cong in Kerala to be revamped

Thiruvananthapuram, A day after a social media post from the official X handle of the Kerala Pradesh Congress Committee (KPCC) sparked outrage by comparing Bihar with bidis, the party has decided to revamp its digital media cell.

Announcing the move on Saturday, KPCC president Sunny Joseph said a new team would soon be constituted to head the social media wing.

The digital cell of the party was earlier headed by Dr P. Sarin, who quit the Congress last year to join the CPI(M) and unsuccessfully contested the Palakkad assembly bypoll.

After Sarin left, the post was held by two-time former Congress legislator V.T. Balam.

The controversy surfaced from a deleted post by @INCKerala that read: "Bidis and Bihar start from B. Cannot be considered a sin anymore."

Soon after the deletion, another post came with an apology. "We see that our jibe at Modi's election gimmick with GST rates is being twisted. Our apologies if you felt hurt."

Following the outbreak of the 'Bihar and Bidi' controversy, Balam, who is based in his hometown in



Palakkad, expressed his desire to be relieved of the post as he was not able to spend enough time as the convenor of the digital wing of the KPCC.

Balam said he was not even aware of such a post. Now, Sunny Joseph, the KPCC president, has announced that a new team would be constituted to head the digital wing of the party.

Incidentally, soon after the controversy surfaced, KPCC working president and senior legislator A.P. Anil Kumar told IANS that it was not an official response of the party, and the general norm for those manning the social media account is that every post gets cleared officially.

The episode drew sharp criticism from several NDA leaders in Bihar, while RJD leader Tejashwi Yadav, too, expressed his displeasure.

J&K LoP accuses NC of instigating national emblem defacing at Hazratbal shrine

Jammu, Senior BJP leader and Leader of Opposition (LoP) in J&K Assembly, Sunil Sharma on Saturday condemned the defacing of the national emblem by hooligans at the Hazratbal shrine on Friday and accused the ruling National Conference (NC) of allegedly supporting separatists and terrorists. Speaking to the media here on Saturday about yesterday's incident in which a group of hooligans defaced the national emblem engraved on an inauguration marble slab at the Hazratbal shrine in Srinagar, Sunil Sharma said, "Whether the emblem should have been engraved on the inauguration stone at the Hazratbal shrine or not, is a different debate, but the real question is whether the defacing of the national emblem is justified?"

"The national emblem is the symbol of India's unity,

integrity and sovereignty and the way the National Conference justifies the issue only confirms the belief that it is a semi-separatist group that has formed itself into a political party supporting anti-national elements and terrorists."

The BJP leader said the way the Congress party is maintaining silence over the issue is not understandable.

"I am not here to give certificates to anybody, but the way the Congress party is maintaining silence over

the issue is not understandable", Sharma said.

It must be recalled that a group of hooligans yesterday defaced the national emblem engraved on a marble slab at the Hazratbal shrine.

The hooligans used stones to smash the national emblem. Police have now registered an FIR into the incident under the relevant sections of law and has started fixing responsibility on those involved in the shameful act.

Darakhshan Andrabi, chairperson of the local Waqf Board yesterday regretted the incident and demanded stringent action against those responsible for the unfortunate incident and those responsible for instigating the hooligans to resort to such an act.

She also blamed the NC, without naming anybody directly, for having instigated the hooligans to indulge in such an anti-national act.

India-US relationship vital, say BJP and allies as Trump calls Modi 'Great PM'

New Delhi, As US President Donald Trump described Prime Minister Narendra Modi as a "great Prime Minister" and reaffirmed the "special relationship" between India and the United States, leaders of India's ruling parties on Saturday welcomed the remarks, emphasising the strategic importance of the bilateral ties.

The statement from President Trump comes amid ongoing tensions between Washington and New Delhi over issues such as tariffs and India's purchase of Russian oil. Speaking from the Oval Office on Friday, Trump said: "I'll always be friends with (Narendra) Modi... He's a great Prime Minister. He's great. But I just don't like what he's doing at this particular moment. Still, India and the United States have a special relationship. There's nothing to worry about. We just have moments on occasion."

BJP MP Ghulam Ali Khatana told IANS, "We welcome all positive statements. We have a strong relationship with the US, including trade. It's commendable. PM Modi's firm stance for the farmers shows maturity and diplomacy."

BJP MP Praveen Khandelwal echoed similar sentiments, saying, "India has always believed in Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam. That is the guiding mantra of PM Modi's foreign policy."

JD(U) leader Rajeev Ranjan emphasised the long-standing value of India-US relations: "The relationship between the two countries is crucial. Police accused of torturing man in custody, trying to pull out teeth with pliers in Kerala

Kulathupuzha Police Station in Kollam district, in the southern part of the state, has come under scanner after allegations of custodial torture, according to a local report.

The report said the incident took place on August 31, when police allegedly attempted to extract the teeth of a 50-year-old man, Anil Kumar of Chozhiyakode in

Kulathupuzha, using a pair of pliers. The victim later underwent treatment at the Punalur Government Taluk Hospital, where the damaged teeth were removed, the report claimed. The Kulathupuzha police denied any custodial torture, stating that he was taken into custody, for creating a nuisance under the influence of alcohol. The police dismissed his claim of attempted teeth extraction, claiming that he was released on bail the same day and showed no health issues at the time. In his complaint to the Punalur Taluk Hospital after feeling unwell, where three teeth were removed surgically,

while he was going home with friends on August 31 on charges of having consumed liquor. He alleged that the police detained him after he objected to their conduct, the media report said.

Anil Kumar alleged that he was assaulted inside the police vehicle and at the station, where the cops tried to pull out his teeth with a pair of pliers. He said he lost consciousness during the ordeal and was taken to the Kulathupuzha Government Hospital. However, Anil Kumar was later admitted to the Punalur Taluk Hospital after feeling unwell, where three teeth were removed surgically.
